Letters. — For each half-ounce, under 3000 miles, 3 cents; over 3000 miles, 10 cents. All letters must be prepaid with a postage stamp.

Drop Letters, 1 cent. Prepayment optional.

Letters to Great Britain and Ireland, by U. States or British line, 24 cents (California and Oregon excepted); 5 cents to be added when to or from California and Oregon. Prepayment optional.

Newspapers and Periodicals, not exceeding 1½ ozs. in weight, when paid quarterly in advance — Daily, per quarter, 23¼ in the State where pub., 45½ out of the State. Six times per week, 19½ in State where pub., 39 out of State. Tri-weekly, 9¾ in State where pub., 19¼ out of State. Semi-weekly, 6½ in State where pub., 13 out of State. Weekly, 3¼ in State where pub., 6½ out of State. Semi-monthly, 1½. Monthly, ¾.

Small Newspapers, published monthly or oftener, and pamphlets not containing more than 16 octavo pages, in packages of 8 ozs. or over, ½ cent per oz.

Weekly Newspapers, within the county where published, *free.*

Transient Newspapers, Periodicals,

to any part of the United States, not weighing over 3 ozs., 1 cent, and 1 cent for each additional oz.

Quarterly payments, in advance, may be made either where published or received.

Books, prepaid, not weighing over 4 pounds, 1 cent per oz.; all fractions over the oz. being counted as an additional oz.

The same, not paid, 1½ cents per oz.

Bills and receipts for payments of moneys for newspapers may be enclosed in subscribers' papers.

Valuable letters will be registered at the office of mailing on the application of the person posting the same, and the payment of a registration fee of 5 cents.
