Lynchville April 6th 1839

For John Richard of Lebanon Richards
we jointly and severally promise to pay him
or bearer twenty seven Dollars for by eight
cents in time at the market price,
to be delivered at the City of New York with
of the time burst of the week for which this
note is given

This was executed of them on account, &
of the "signs of the times" on the part of G. W.
and Captain Lane to help fill out our letters
the time all remains at the
the time as yet. However not when it will be
haunted or sold or any way secured

Went you when you write again to say something
about M. W. and E. R. — believe they think
they may hang back in regard to paying over
that not E. R. better give a check, doubtless
belongs to you

Richard Richards has not presented his order,
shall take care for that, you know what is
him meant — but to stop the trouble
off you think but to stop the trouble

Forward name it when you write again,
Mr. Bury, and Coleman's family, are in

health as you left them —
have been there, think much of you
how good is a good name, hope you will
ever receive such — the other family
of Bury, will part think they want him

Believing all and not claim at all
has brought a dispute upon me
beyond any thing that has ever happened
in our country, this is my opinion but
if may all work well, hope it will.

We have long for the arrival of the great
Western, we hear she has arrived, report
says the English and inclined to settle
according to the treaty of eight years
I doubt it but shall know the result

A word more and close, we all want to
see you, your mother is ever with you
We all wish you well, hope you will ever conduct
yourself as a man, and as life is more uncertain
than any thing else, let us prepare to meet it
that stand where we are and firmly. will never
be removed. We remain your affectionate parent
