The Eastern part of the state threw a
bombardment going, but the northern &
western part of the state have caused
such an earth quake that I doubt
whether there are loes enough left
to tell the news. There is so close
a run in Pennsylvania that it is
not known for certain how she
has gone, but by express it is

11/12/1840

pretty evident that she has gone
for the whigs, The news come
in like thunder for the whigs, in
short

Mr Garrison is elected

The Soos here give it up
without Pennsylvania or Virginia

at this time as I have half doz
more letters to write
