By Mr Foster - ~~has~~ received I was

with David Crockett about going a head  
but when you receive a little Pork & Flour  
to lean over I apprehend that you will feel  
better, from the fact that Timber will  
bring a great price next Spring I can not  
give up the Idea of getting all the timber  
possible, you speak of hay as a cooking  
high, I will haul the timber at half of you  
prefer and be at half the expence of the cooking  
materials, ~~if~~ you can get hay for \$20 Per ton  
engage ~~two~~ tons at that price or less if you can not  
get that quantity, if hay can not be obtained  
on the Ceranook I shall haul it from here  
I shall be ~~in~~ at the River ~~on~~ ~~by~~  
Monday next at which time I will bring the  
blankets, Aule, men-hing Iron, more boots, Spoons  
&c, Timber will be worth all of \$500 Per ton  
in St Johns next Spring, you need not stand  
fear of making a loss, go for I will insure  
you otherwise
