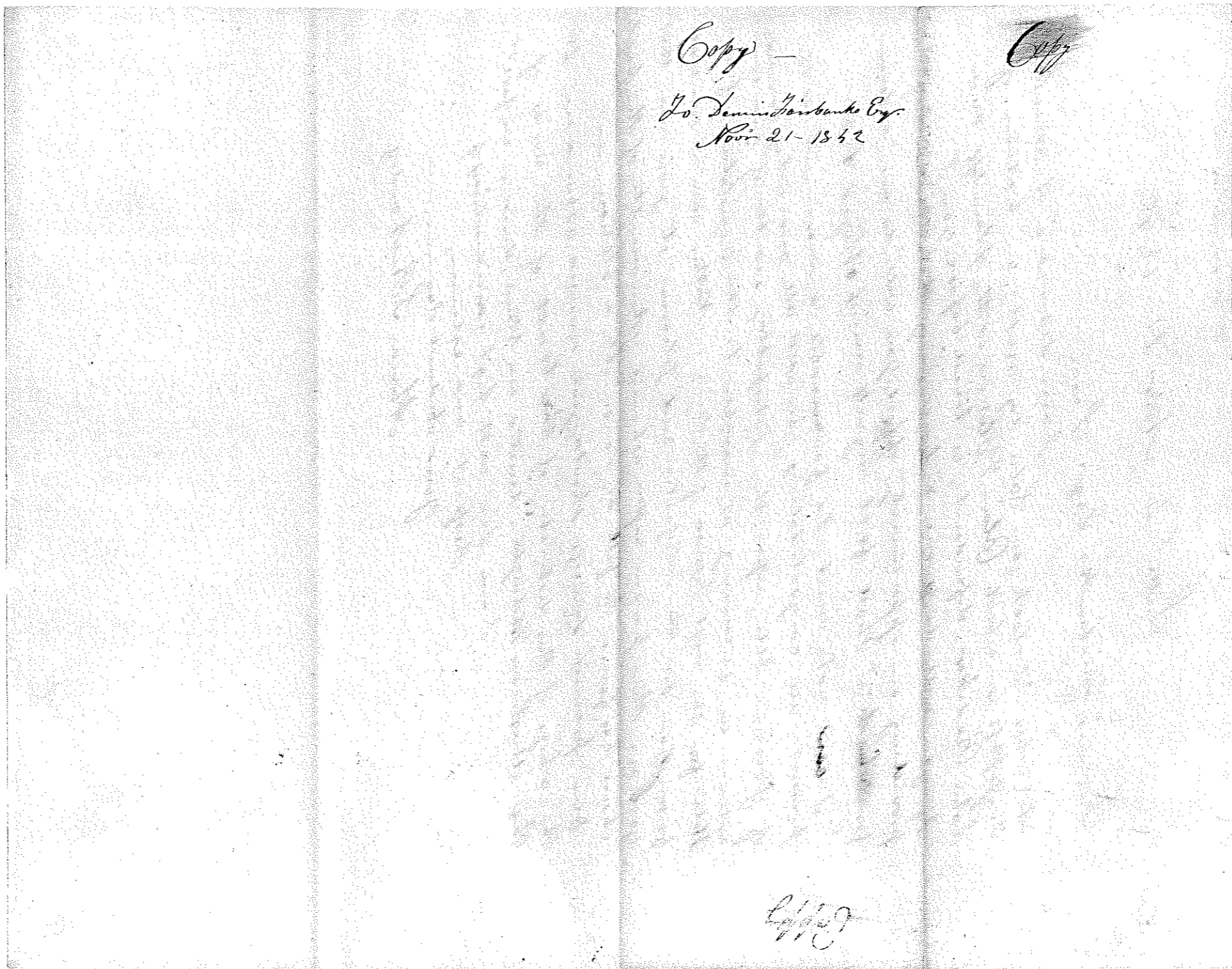

Letter D. Nov 21 - 1842

Dear Mr. Matthews Esq, Sir: -

Our present success should give renewed assurance to the whigs of this district of the truth of the words of the illustrious Washington, "United we stand, divided we fall." -
