Dear Sir:—

I hope and expect you will be in attendance at our plantation meeting to-morrow. Don't let 6 feet of snow prevent you from being on the spot in good season for the spot—and fun. Perhaps the Locos won't want to let to vote, but you must give them a hard try. Bring away what you can with you.

To-morrow is the day, we must try to win if ever. Let us catch and all who has a true Whig soul in his bosom make one effort to regain that liberty which has been trampled under foot by our political opponents. Let us make one desperate effort, firmly and unitedly and the day I trust is ours. Let nothing but death prevent your attendance. Say nothing to the Locos, but arouse every Whig you can see a chance
