Boston Dec 10 1845
Dear Brother I received yours of nov 11 it
and was happy to hear from you dear brother
you must excuse me for not answering your
letter before this and I will now say that we
are both well and hope this will find you and
family the same I received a letter from father
since I received yours and he said they were all
well excepting Phebe and she was quite sick
with a disorder in her head and had been
for some time but I hope she is well before
this we expect to stay here this winter and go
home in the spring we are at the same places
we were when you wrote and expect to stay
til we go home and the people we live with
are very nice folks and I like my
place very much in deed and they like
me for I have been living here more than
a year we have had some cold weather here
lately and I expect it is cold where you
live but I hope the winter will soon pass a
way for I want to see my friends a gain
very much Dear brother it has been a long time
since I saw you and how much longer I know not
but I hope it wont be long Father says you
want him to go and live with you and
I hope he will for I know that mother would

like it verry much. Farther said that
Mary was going to be married soon
and I presume you know something a bout
it before now, but I have not got a beau
and do not want any for I do not think
much of these Boston Gops for they are
to grand for me and I think those who have
the best to do with them are the best of
Almon you must write us as often as you
can for we shall want to hear from you
as often we can and we will try to
write you often we should like to see your
littl son for we expect it is verry handsome
and you must kiss it for us give our
love to your Wife Almon you must
excuse the writing for my pen is verry
poor and you must correct all the mistakes
for I expect there is a good many in this
letter I must now close for it is getting
late and I cant think of any thing
more to write now you must write
as soon as you get this, but I do not know
as you will be able to read this letter
but I hope you will, so now I must
bid you all good bye
