Dear Brother I now take my pen in hand to inform you that I am well and hope this will find you the same we received your letter and was glad to hear you we should have written to you before now but we have not had an opportunity Dear brother we thank you for your good advice and we shall endeavor to treasure it up we had a letter from home Friday and the folks were all well Dear brother we all want to see you very much for it has been a long time since we saw you but I hope we shall see you soon dear brother you must write as often as you can for we shall write to you and when you write tell us if you think of visiting Lincolnville again for money and I some thinks of making should a visit in a year from now if nothing should happen dear brother how often I have thought of you since I last saw you and what would I give could I but see you now I am writing for money and I both while she is willing to gather you hair our best wishes for your welfare and we hope you will ever prosper and do well Dear Brother I have not much more to write you but to say that I live on ~~the~~ Pineknay Street No 12 you must excuse my writing for my pen and ink are very poor and I write in haste I must now close so good bye at present I remain your most affectionate sister
