I wrote you a letter, in november, but did not receive an anser. and I thought I would write you a nother. for I think, you did not receive it. or you would have wrote me befo re now. we are well and hope this will find you the same. we had a letter from Father not long since. and he said he was expecting a letter from you every day. he said that Mary was married the 2 day of december. Phebe has been quite sick but she is quite well now Moneg and I. are still living, at the same places. and we expect to stay here till July, if nothing should happen. and then, we think, we shall go home. we have not had much sleighing here this winter. but I expect you have had a enough, where you live. buisness, is good here. and wages are high but I dont have but 1 dollar and a quarter a week. Almon you must write us as often as you can for we, should like, to hear from you ~~or~~ often.

I havent, much news to write. but to say, that there, has been a great many fears, in Boston. since I have been here. the bells, are ringing for five, the most of the time. it is now, most ten o'clock, at night. and I, cant think of any thing more to write now
