Lincolnville June 26 - 1847

I can write but few words at this time
'most all of the family are unwell,
yesterday and day before very hot
weather, man, and beast, almost over-
come by it, it has been the wettest
season we ever knew, some have
not done their planting nor
sowing, nor wout this year, their
land is so wet. Provisions are
very high, Flour 12 doll., Corn 1.50
and not a Barrel, or a kernel in
Lincolnville for sale, I have a little
of my own raising, yet.

you will find a sections of the
new post office law on one of the papers
that I shall send you with this letter.
I should like to know how you construe it,
there are very various opinions here
among us, concerning it.

If any number of the Herald be missing
up to this time, I wish you to inform me,
I have sent all the numbers of the pres-
ent volume to the 20th in the manner
