I shall have to stop, for to do any better than

May be you are in the mood to work, if that
be the case be sure that you write when you
get out, and if you should tell me how little
George does, but I dont mean him in particular
for I am very desirous to know how the
Father and Mother, and all the Children are,
we have had but 2 or 3 flirts of snow this winter,
