I Charles B. Johnston of lawful age on oath depose and say that, I was interested in a lumber operation with William Johnston and A. S. Richards we were making and hauling lumber by the ton under a written contract for Long & Drew which contract marked A. is herewith annexed. While operating under said contract David Cyp and Thomas Cyp worked for us by the month commencing I think the latter the latter part of November and continuing to work by the month until the thirtieth of January after which we made an agreement with them to haul for us by the ton which agreement was in writing and herewith annexed and marked B. after that they hauled under said agreement they had their supplies whels wholly under the contract marked B they had their supplies of Long and Drew. I know this fact because I have heard them say so time and again and I have seen them getting supplies at Long and Drews Store for their operation

Inter by Plaintiff here Mr Long Did you in any time read over this account furnished for supplies furnished the said Cyp's for said operation
