

Maxim Cyr of lawful age depose and
 say that I drove a four horse team for
 Francis Crook from December 8th 1856 to
 April 10th 1857 hauling timber cut by A. S.
 Richards and Company on letters of
 Long and Drew of Fort Fairfield. Said
 Francis had a two horse team besides the
 team driven by me during said time
 and a portion of the time a third team
 and from three to six men during the
 winter - a large portion of said timber was
 hauled over twelve miles and none under
 ten miles - we hauled some from the stumps
 that was fifteen miles from the River St John
 where we hauled to -

We hauled one hundred and twenty trees of
 pine timber and thirty trees of tamarac timber
 the pine averaged over two tons to a tree and
 the tamarac a little over one ton to a tree -
 we hauled not far from three hundred tons
 in all for Long and Drew that winter -
 I do not now recollect the exact number
 of tons. I do recollect the number of trees as
 I counted them on the bank -

In addition to the timber hauled as above
 stated the teams and men of Francis Crook
 hauled timber for A. S. Richards and Co.
