Dr Sir

The Shingles that  
I am afraid have got very

I would buy by Dots &  
I would not have a single

& get for the first quality  
made for it may hurt  
them to clear my contract  
this must be done & at  
once by speaking to all  
trades they will do it

All men must do the  
same - I bought 2 Bbls

Nothing at Bolton all  
I could find they were  
to come by boat to La  
Fam - I shall send some  
goods when I have a chance  
there is no more - I will  
Agent away -

Don't fail about the  
Shingle business & have it  
done at once you can  
pay more for them but  
tell every man you  
will give them a good  
trade & make every customer  
get from 5 to 10 in  
at once - Send word  
to Lang Park & take  
no shingles without  
looking at them
