for god knows what is best, and he doeth
all things for the best, I send you
stockings and hope they will suit the
yarn was very coarse but they will be
all the warmer Lizzie when I was there
we did not plan right for that quilt I
need two strips more for the sides and
then it will look very much better if you

drawers combined and they are so
comfortable I should like a pair for
myself I wish you could send me
some white stocking yarn. I have nothing
to knit and we need some very much
Send stocking yarn first if you have it ready
Send sock yarn too if you have it ready I
will send something for the butter as
soon as I can, if you had anything to put
ten or fifteen pounds in and could send to
me you could charge to the old account or I
send for you to pay for it your butter is
so good I want some and we will take half
I will write soon or come down from you
