Stewart III is a third generation native of Presque Isle who graduated from Presque Isle High School in 2012 and earned his degree in political science and sociology in 2016 from the University of Maine.

He has twice been elected as the youngest currently serving member of the Maine State Legislature. In 2016, he successfully ran for a seat in the Maine Legislature—a two-year term in the Maine House of Representatives—and completed an MBA during his first term in office from the University of Maine. In 2018, he was re-elected to the Maine House and elected by his caucus peers to serve as the Assistant Republican Leader in the House. He is one of the youngest legislators in the nation currently serving in a senior leadership post.

Rep. Stewart is a member of the Presque Isle Rotary Club, the Masonic Lodge, the Central Aroostook Chamber of Commerce, and serves on the boards of The NMCC Foundation, the Aroostook County Action Program, the University of Maine Alumni Association, and the UMPI Board of Visitors.

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT

Mr. P. Daniel Ladner was born in Presque Isle in 1937, the son of Fay and Viola Ladner, and graduated from Mapleton High School in 1955 as valedictorian and president of his graduating class. He graduated from Aroostook State Teachers College (now UMPI) as president of his class in 1959 with a degree in education.

He enjoyed a 40-year career in education, making time to direct the high school chorus and drama club and help found the Shipmates Playhouse at Presque Isle High School, produce numerous Broadway musicals at the Caribou Performing Arts Center, serve as a judge for state drama festivals, and host the County Tele Quiz throughout the 1970s and 1980s. He was a driving force with UMPI's Pioneer Playhouse, a founding member of the Presque Isle Community Players, and longtime Rotarian with the Caribou Rotary Club who has been named a Paul Harris Fellow by both the Caribou and Presque Isle Rotary Clubs. He has served as the director of the Caribou Choral Society since 1977 and has been the long-time organist and choir director at St. Mary's Catholic Church and Grant Memorial United Methodist Church, both in Presque Isle.

Among his many accolades, Ladner was named a lifetime member of the New England Drama Council in 1987, the Citizen of the Year by the City of Presque Isle in 1988, the recipient of the Spirit of Caribou award in 1997, the recipient of the first-ever Lifetime Achievement Award from the Maine Arts Sponsors Association, and the recipient of the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Presque Isle Chamber of Commerce in 2004. He has twice received UMPI's Distinguished Alumni Award.

Academic Attire

Academic caps, gowns, and hoods date back to about the 12th Century. They probably started in France, for the wearing of a cap and gown marked the admission of a licentiate to the group of master teachers. These caps and gowns were the outer garments worn by the masters to keep out the chill and dampness of the medieval buildings. Because most of the masters were clerics, our present day caps and gowns are outgrowths of the long, flowing robes worn at that time.

The hood probably was adopted from the monk's cowl, which was originally attached to the gown, but became detached when the wearing of a cap became popular.

The mortarboard cap evolved from the skull cap which the scholars wore.

Caps and gowns have been used in this country from Colonial times. Columbia, or King's College as it was then called, adopted a local code and others also had codes of their own. A commission representing the leading American colleges met in 1894 to discuss the academic costume and a year later the American Intercollegiate Code was adopted.

The Academic Gown

The Code provides that the Bachelor shall wear a black gown with long pointed sleeves. The Oxford gown, worn closed, was adopted in America. The Master's gown is worn open. It has long closed sleeves squared at the ends, which fall below the knees with a slit for the arms near the elbow.

The Doctor's gown is also worn open. The sleeves are bell shape and very full. The front of the gown is faced with velvet and the sleeves have three velvet bars. The color of the velvet facing and bars may either be the color of the degree earned or black.

The Academic Cap

The Oxford cap, or mortarboard, worn for all degrees, is of black cloth and usually has a black tassel. Those holding the Doctorate wear gold tassels, while holders of the Bachelor's and Master's degrees generally wear a black tassel although in recent years it has often become customary to wear a colored tassel symbolizing, like the hood, the subject area in which the wearer has taken his degree. Tassels are placed over the left temple.

The Academic Hood

The hoods can be distinguished by both length and color. The Bachelor's hood measures three feet, the Master's three and one-half, and the Doctor's four. The color of the velvet edging, which is wider for the higher degrees than for the Bachelor's, indicates the subject area to which the degree pertains. In addition to the colored edging, the hood shows in its lining the official color or colors of the institution which awarded the degree. The hood is worn in such a way that a large part of the lining is visible.

The Color Code

The color code used to distinguish the different faculties or subjects is given below. Most of the colors selected have come down from the past. The white for Arts is from the ermine trimming of Oxford and Cambridge hoods; scarlet symbolizes the burning faith and zeal of the church; pink was adopted from the pink brocade of the Oxford Doctor of Music; Law from the royal purple of the Kings Courts, while Philosophy took royal blue, the color of truth and wisdom; the green of Medicine from the color of medicinal herbs; the golden yellow of Science from the untold wealth which has been brought forth by research in this branch of knowledge; the russet of Forestry from the same color dress of the English forester.
